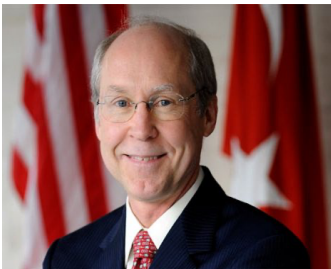
This informal discussion and Q&A is presented by the
